Aileen Brendel and Gagan Kaushik were honored with awards at this years graduation ceremony.

About Aileen's Thesis topic:

Pacific oysters have colonized the German Wadden Sea over the past 20 years, acting as ecosystem engineers by constructing permanent oyster reefs. This phenomenon creates new habitats with higher biodiversity. Aileen simulated the effects of oysters on tidal current spread in the Wadden Sea and compared these simulations with experimental results.

About Gagan's Thesis topic:

Thanks to machine learning, increasingly reliable empirical approaches can be obtained from big data. However, the generation of large amounts of data in engineering often requires complex and expensive sensor technology. Gagan's Master's thesis helped to understand their behavior in the context of mechanical problems.
