This has developed into various forms where digital media have established a remix and mashup machine that has generated a rich range of recombinant appropriations

- compiled videos, samplings, remixes, reboots, mashups, short clips, and other material involving text, sound, and image.

These appropriation practices raise a variety of questions which will be addressed in this conference: from changes in reception and distribution, aspects of researching, teaching and learning, to copyright and referencing.
